

# Christmas Tree Napkin



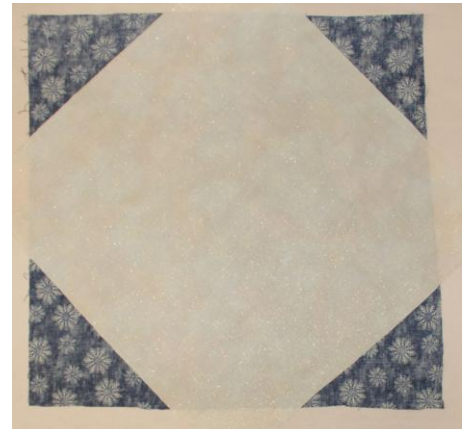
## Materials and Supplies:

- 2 fat quarters, or 2- 18" squares of light weight cotton fabric
- Temporary spray adhesive, such as KK2000 or 505
- 24" pillow template available on [www.pamdamour.com](http://www.pamdamour.com)
- Fabric pencil or pen
- Serger sewing machine, set up for rolled edge
- Three spools of thread. (Wooly poly or wooly nylon works best)

## To Make:

- Press each fabric square flat.
- With wrong sides together, place one square on grain, and one on point. Spray on the wrong side of one fabric to baste it to the wrong side of the other fabric.

*The purpose of doing this is so that each fabric stabilizes the other, and when one fabric is being sewn on the bias (stretchy) grain, the other is on the straight grain, and preventing the fabric from stretching.*



- Using the 24" pillow square, draw a 18" (or the largest circle you can) with your fabric pen or pencil.
- Snip into the edge, up to the line and cut on the line a few inches.



- Put cut edge into the serger, lining up your mark with the serger knife.



- Serge all the way around. When you come to the starting point, overlap the stitches about 2 inches, and sew off. Trim threads and press flat.



#### To Fold:

- Fold napkin in half, with one edge extending slightly.
- Starting at one third in from edge, begin to accordion fold back and forth, until your napkin takes the shape of a Christmas tree.
- If you wish, tie with a small ribbon & bow.
